


BACKGROUND:

What really happened in December of 2012?

Was the internet so swept up in 'memetic' culture and conspiracy videos, that they invented a symbolic demon, to satiate their collective fears? Why would hundreds of thousands of anonymous authors create interrelated stories which all conspired around a curious set of events, and an online cult?

Did the 'Cult of Saturn' really exist?

In a final analysis, the horror meme that was 'The Supervillain' who's origins were not dissimilar to 'the slender man', had far stranger and darker roots. The urban legend, and internet myth surrounding a man named 'Frank Webster', may have been born on 4chan, or the 'something awful' forums, around the same time as Slender.

According to an article by Santos Mcallef, the stories have been around since at least 2009, but potentially 5 to 10 years earlier still. The Mcallef article seems like a good introduction to anyone who is knew to the story of the 4chan born cult:

Nowadays there's so many pieces of fan fiction about 'The Cult of Saturn', that apathy and disbelief often surround new entries to the series. But every now and again a new testimony strikes a match, and lights a candle, which reminds us why we were so terrified of that particular darkness in the first place.

A barely known Redditor called 'Goitye Powerhouse' who claims to have written his tales from inside a mental institution in Australia seemed like an unlikely source for a revival of interest in the bizarre and occult happenings of 2012.

At first his collection of posts, (Deposited randomly into various subreddits) went unnoticed and sank with little to no votes, but a wave of growing interest has had the interwoven stories being shared on social media in recent weeks, and reconsidered as perhaps the most important additions to the 'Cult of Saturn' mythsos.

After shared texts and emails surfaced that the user 'Goitye Powerhouse' had sent weird PM's to other Redditors, his stories were reconsidered as canon. Could these stories actually be based in any tangible reality? Or at the very least, are they the genuine delusions of a clinical schizophrenic? You'll have to decide that for yourself.

For the first time... 'Blacklab publishing', collects 'Goitye Powerhouse's - The Supervillain' in its original six chapters, including all the connected stories by other authors. But be warned, each one of these six chapters... may light a candle — illuminating deeper webs of darkness, opening up new doorways to forbidden corners of the internet.
